Meeting Minutes:

- 1. Welcome & Introductions (Dr. Maura Rossman, Co-Chair):
 - Dr. Rossman opened the meeting at 8:32 am.
 - Welcome to members and visitors who came to hear about the regional partnership planning.
- 2. Regional Partnership Report (Elizabeth Kromm):
 - Revised planning structure to be more care setting specific.
 - Accomplishments July-November 2015:
 - o Held 24 large group meetings
 - o 39 planning/prep meetings
 - Targeted Populations:
 - o Howard County Residents
 - At least 2 hospital encounters
 - o Medicare high utilizers as determined from CRISP report.

- Community Care Team:
 - Using CCT model to target population.
 - CCT based on Camden Coalition model
- Selected Interventions:
 - o Acute:
 - Much to do internally at HCGH
 - Clear pathway to have care managed and seamless communication with providers at discharge.
 - Partnering with home care to help increase CCT referrals.
 - Bring PCP's and hospital together.
 - Planning to expand on how currently doing medication reconciliation.
 - Patient involvement based on particular patients' preference.
 - Beginning to make changes to discharge materials.
 - Post-acute:
 - Working with Lorien, Gilchrist and CIMS.
 - Developing standardized discharge processes from HCGH to skilled nursing facilities.
 - Beginning to do monthly chart reviews between Lorien, Gilchrist and HCGH.
 - Exploring if telemedicine would be useful.
 - o Primary Care:
 - Connecting to Advanced Primary Care Collaborative to engage with practices.
 - Beginning to push referrals towards CCT.
 - Readying practices to engage in care coordination.
 - Using as model to bring other practices on in calendar year 2016.
- Governance Structure:
 - Need to decide if we need to add sub-committee on prevention.
 - Begin to determine how the Regional Partnership will tie in with the LHIC.
 - Trying to avoid having redundant committees that are working towards the same goal.
- 3. Creating an Age-Friendly Community (Phyllis Madachy and Peggy Hoffman):
 - Commissioned by the Department of Citizen Services
 - Discussion between futurists, baby-boomers, health policy analysts and consultants familiar with aging trends on the county, state and federal level.
 - Input from more than 1500 people in the community
 - o Individuals age 45 and over completed surveys
 - o 70-80 individuals participated in workgroups
 - Reviewed approximately 13 reports and recommendations about the aging population in Howard County.
 - Demographics:
 - o 50-plus population is fastest growing population in Maryland.
 - o By 2035, 50-plus population will be majority minority.
 - Planning and Priorities:
 - o Planning process identified 6 priorities.
 - County Government and Community Stakeholders will share the responsibility for carrying out the priorities.
