- More people aged under 30 diagnosed with diabetes than those who are age 60 an over this year.
- Those under the age of 45 and those making less than \$200,000 a year were more likely to seek care in the emergency room instead of making a medical appointment.
- There were significant percentage of respondents who reported they had postponed wellness screening and preventive screenings due to COVID concerns across all the demographics.

2022 - 2025 HCLHIC Strategic Plan Update

Reena Rambharat presented an overview of HCLHIC Strategic planning process and key findings. The followings are three main priorities for FY2022-2025.

- Healthy Beginnings to prevent and care for gestational diabetes, maternal and child health, and pediatric obesity
- Healthy Living Priority to prevent Chronic disease and to increase physical activity and healthier food and beverage choices.
- **Healthy Minds Priority** to decrease social isolation and support mental health.

Members were encouraged to provide their feedback to the chat box while reviewing each proposed plan goals and sample strategies.

Ms. Rambharat stated that HCLHIC was seeking feedback on the draft strategic plan and redesigned website by sharing a survey link via the last Action Alert and asked those who hadn't had a chance yet to complete the survey.
