- I. Introductions Liddy opened the meeting at 9:00.
- II. Approval of minutes from 1.28.16 One correction to the minutes – Tara Butler was present. With this correction, minutes from 1.28.16 were approved.
- III. Election of New Co-Chair

The group elected DeWayne Oberlander, CEO of Columbia Medical Practice, as co-chair.

IV. Open Discussion – Create Action Plan that is achievable in 2016

The group had a discussion around a unified definition of access to care:

- Know where to go (to apply, to get care) navigation
- Transportation
- Affordable subsidies/benefits
- Culturally and linguistically appropriate services
- Health insurance literacy
- Comprehensive Rx, medical, DME, behavioral health, dental

• Provider availability (local, accessible) - Network adequacy – uninsured through private pay Barriers discussed at last meeting:

- Money high deductible plans, social determinants, need to meet other needs first
- Create materials on preventive services that are free
- More widespread screening for eligibility for assistance
- Cultural/LEP competency
- Confusion around system, disincentives

## **Covering Wisconsin Informational Materials**

Liddy introduced healthy literacy and health insurance literacy materials from Covering Wisconsin. Materials have been vetted via focus groups and have been promoted by national organizations. Brainstormed ways to distribute: Can HCGH include in their mailing? OOA resource guides and caregiver guide?

Also a need to communicate some information to providers, particularly around not charging for free services. Patients are confused when they go for a preventive service and then also receive care that they are then charged for.

Languages – currently only in English Invest in translation – Spanish, Korean, Chinese

Electronically – perhaps via 211 and the LHIC website Mobile-enabled (long-term)
