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one-hour training for certificated professionals. This training serves to fulfil mandates established by Lauryn's Law (COMAR 13A.07.11). This regulation requires Student Suicide Prevention and Safety Training for staff that includes training on: responding to youth suicide, student trauma, student safety, and other topics related to student health and well-being; and, identifying professional resources to help students in crisis. Additionally, students in grades 6-9 will be participating in the Signs of Suicide training. The system will continue to identify strategies for elementary level education and continuing education for 10-12 grades.
