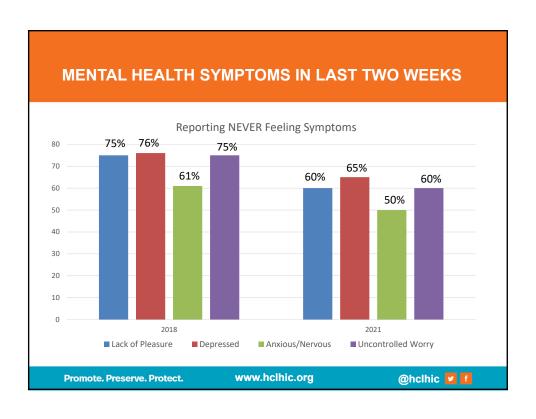
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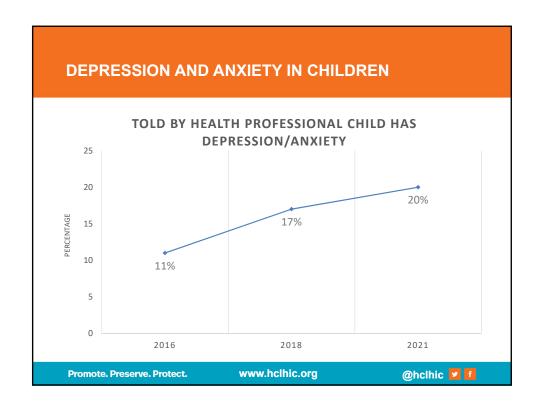
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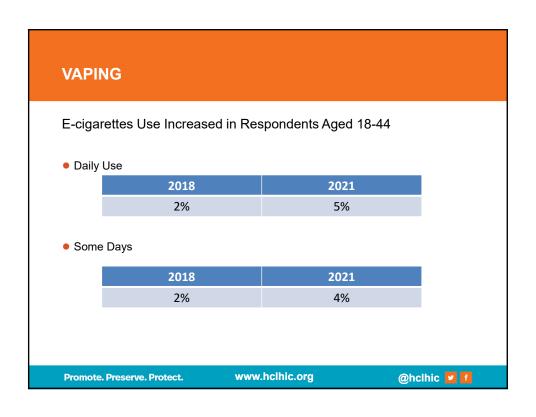












#### **BINGE DRINKING IN PAST 30 DAYS**

- In 2021, there was a significant increase in those reporting 5 or more occasions of binge drinking.

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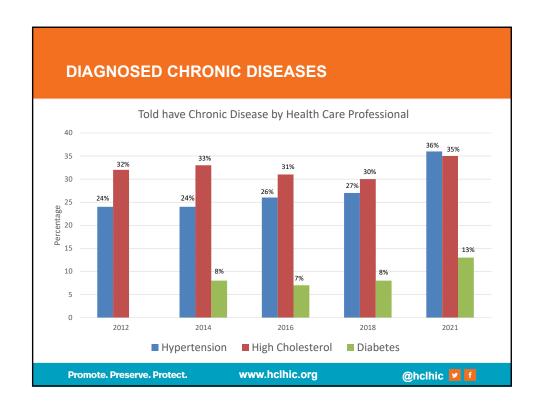

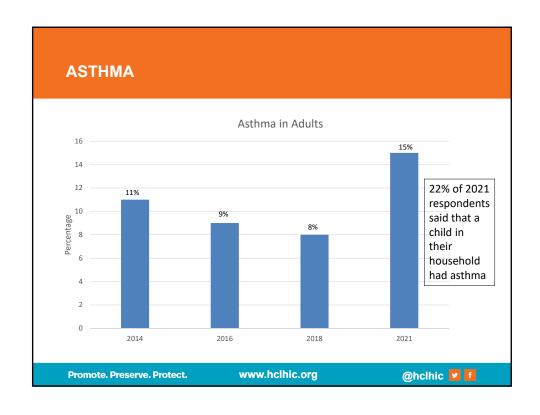


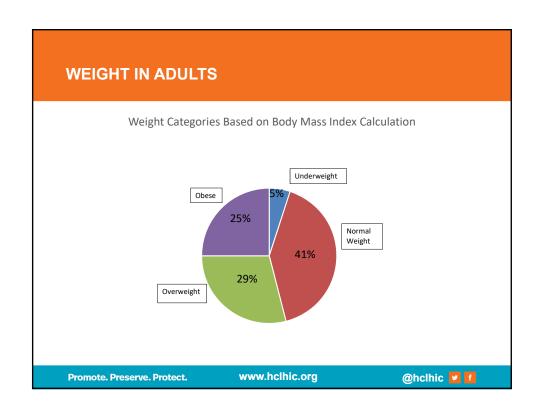
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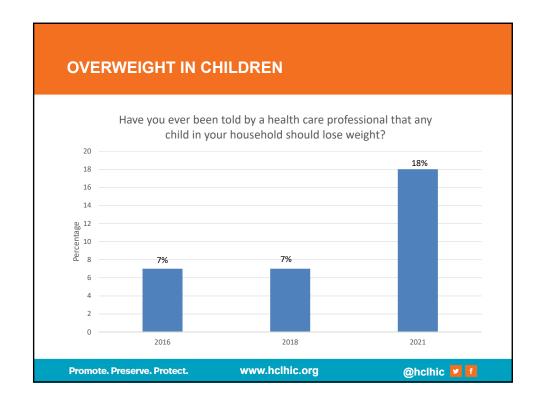
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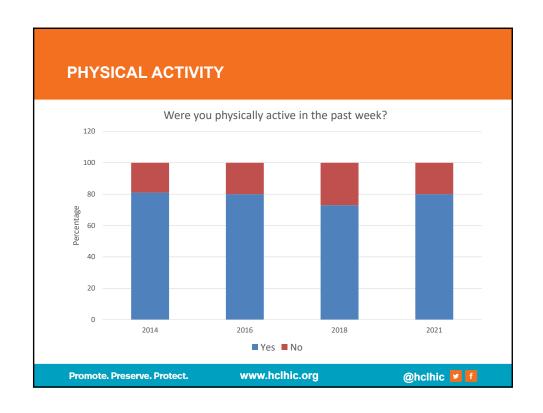


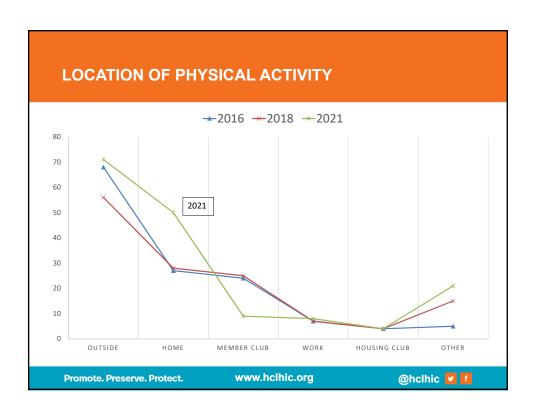


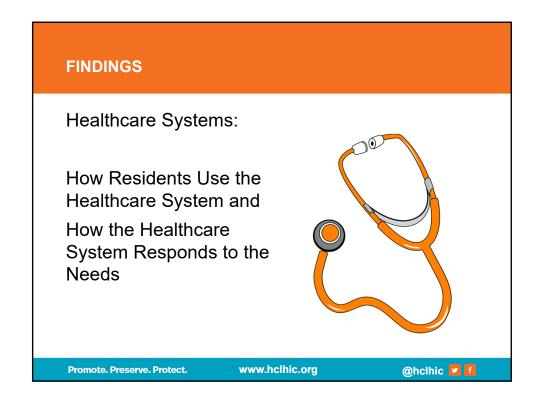


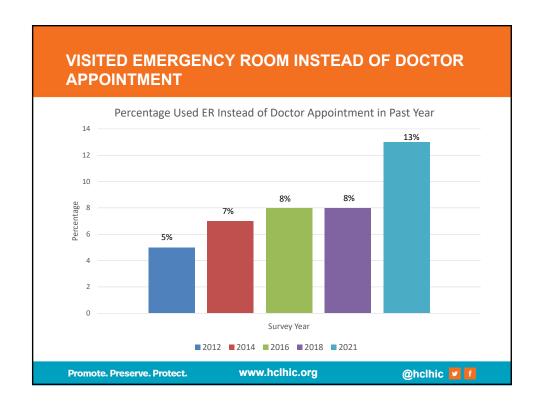


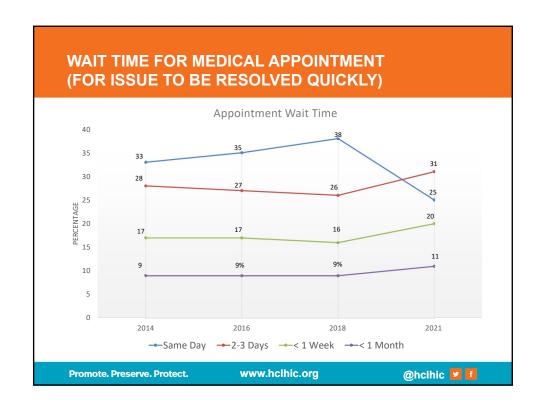
# SUGARY DRINKS AND HEALTHY EATING Regular soda and sports drinks consumption increased with fewer people reporting they rarely or never drink them There was a slight increase in children drinking 1 or more sodas per day (4% to 10%) Vegetable and fruit consumption increased; however 32% eat vegetables less than once a day 38% eat fruit less than once a day Promote. 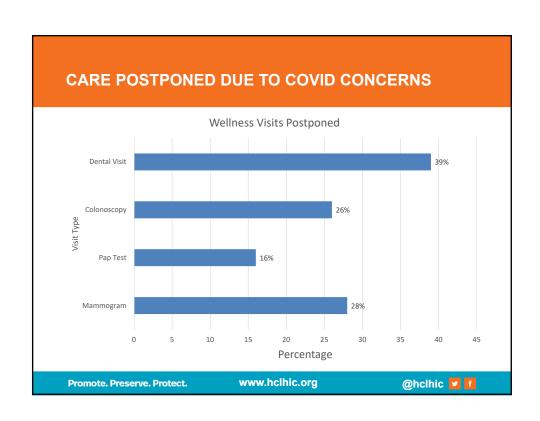


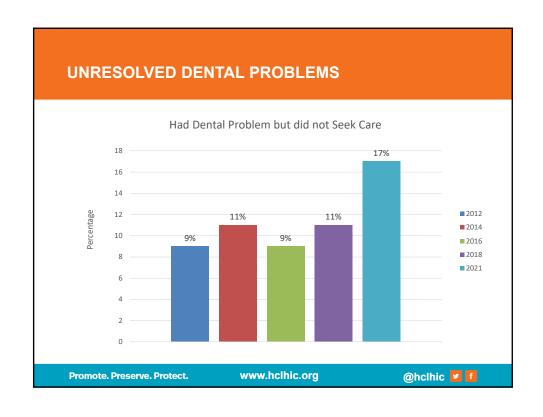


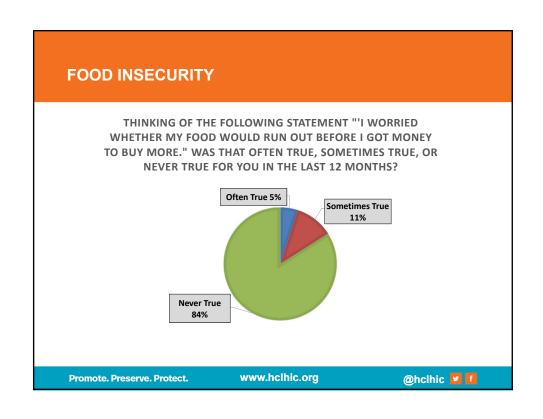

#### PHASES AND KEY FINDINGS

#### PHASE I - July

 Member Survey: Aging across lifespan, social isolation, social media engagement, community presence

#### PHASE II - September

- Two virtual community forums: Physical activity events: outdoors/virtual; Expanded healthy eating classes, subsidized farmer's market, community gardens; Other concerns: Isolation, Aging, Chronic diseases
- Four Round table discussions (Healthy Beginnings, Healthy Living, Mind Health and Community Engagement Grantees): Increased awareness and access to (free/lowcost) classes, activities and resources across the lifespan, policy changes, cultural considerations, chronic diseases and communicating with priority populations through trusted navigators and outreach efforts.

- Draft priorities, feedback survey, present at October's Full LHIC Meeting
- Review by co-chairs, vote and finalize
- Form Workgroups and Action Groups

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#### DRAFT COALITION PRIORITIES

Through strategic Community Engagement the Howard County Local Health Improvement Coalition works to promote health and to prevent and support management of chronic diseases across the lifespan.

- 1. Healthy Beginnings: Engage community members in culturally appropriate and accessible healthy lifestyle activities related to prevention and care for gestational diabetes, maternal and child health and prevention of pediatric obesity.
- 2. Healthy Living Priority: Engage community members in culturally appropriate and accessible healthy lifestyle activities and health promotion related to chronic disease prevention and care, increased physical activity and healthier food and beverage choices.
- 3. Healthy Minds Priority: Engage community members across the lifespan in culturally appropriate and accessible activities and health promotion to decrease social isolation and support mental health.

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#### PROPOSED PLAN GOALS AND SAMPLE STRATEGIES

Goal 1: Engage residents in healthy lifestyle activities by increasing awareness, access and culturally appropriate communications related to physical activity and nutrition resources in Howard County

 Plan, implement and evaluate a Social Marketing campaign to disseminate messages around healthy lifestyles for residents across the lifespan in Howard County.

Goal 2: Encourage Howard County residents of all ages and abilities to walk and move for improved physical and mental health

- Plan, implement and evaluate Howard County Walktober initiatives comprised of a calendar of events and webinars around walking/moving to encourage Howard County residents of all ages and abilities to walk and move for improved physical and mental health.
- Establish a Walking Action Plan comprised of Walktober plans and a toolkit to encourage Howard County residents of all ages and abilities to walk and move for improved physical and mental health year-round.

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#### PROPOSED PLAN GOALS AND SAMPLE STRATEGIES

Goal 3: Increase culturally appropriate and accessible messaging around chronic disease prevention and support for managementrelated health conditions for all ages and abilities.

 Convene quarterly Chronic Disease Management Community Provider forums to ensure awareness and access to resources and coordinated community planning.

Goal 4: Collaborate with internal and external partners to facilitate programs/events to engage residents in reducing stigma and increasing awareness around mental health topics across the lifespan and increase awareness of and access to community resources in Howard County.

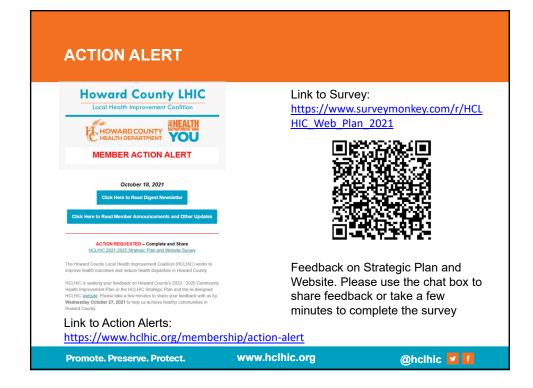

- Increase community outreach and education targeting hard-toreach priority populations in their place of residences.

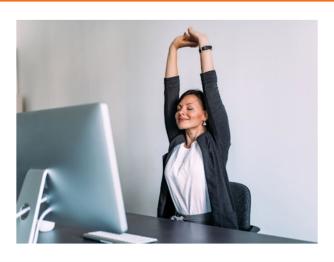

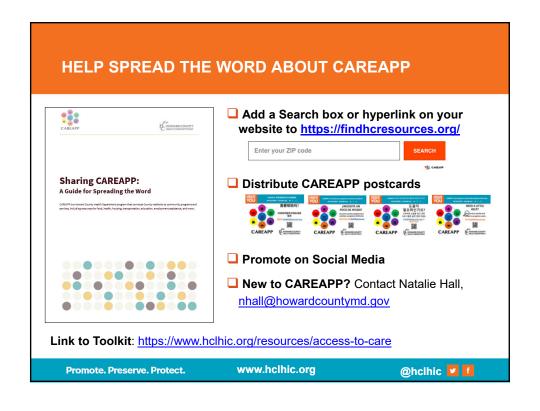

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#### **TOBACCO GRANT - GENERAL PURPOSE**

The Howard County Health Department seeks to fund community-based organization(s) to reach populations/groups identified as at risk for tobacco/vape use, or having a known health disparity related to tobacco, and advance health equity efforts to provide anti-tobacco/vaping use prevention, education, and cessation resources. Tobacco use, including cigarette smoking, cigar smoking, and smokeless tobacco use, remains the leading preventable cause of death in the United States.

#### Project must address one of the following grant objectives:

- 1. Reduce initiation of use for all tobacco products among youth
- 2. Increase awareness among adults about youth vaping
- 3. Promote and provide referral to smoking cessation resources and services
- 4. Influence social norms and public health policies regarding tobacco products

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#### **TOBACCO GRANT - REQUIREMENTS**

**Funding** 

- Funding period: November 15, 2021 May 31, 2022
- Award amount: up to \$3,000

• Half of the funds will be issued upon award and contract execution. The second payment will be issued upon receipt of mid-term report.

Reporting

**Application** 

- Reports due: February 15, 2022 and May 31, 2022; report all activities, outcomes, and expenditures on the provided reporting template
- Required attendance: 2 grantee meetings and 1 Howard County Local Health Improvement Coalition (HCLHIC) meeting; be prepared to provide updates on the progress of the project

- Electronic application due: October 31, 2021 to LHIC@howardcountymd.gov
- Project proposal must meet 1 of the stated grant objectives
- Applicant must be a current non-profit **or** for-profit group in Howard County; and registered and in "Good Standing" with the State
