	Mr. Wilson also pulled up the Walk to School graphics. They will be sharing them 1x a week on the HCHD social	

media and various HCHD Newsletters and other media formats. Ms. Lloyd will also share the graphics with the Movement workgroup and LHIC membership. The graphics are groups of people walking to school on crosswalks, make it cute and fun for the social media campaign.

Ms. Terri Taylor, Howard County Fire and Rescue Services (HCFS), has been contacted about the safety aspect of students walking to school. Parents are upset about the bus route changes and the ramifications for the school system with car riders and the safety aspect because people don't want to walk their kids to school. Pedestrian safety is also a concern.

Ms. Tavia Patusky, Columbia Association (CA), said at the recent board meeting some questions came up by board members related to students walking on the pathways to access schools. The President of CA spoke with HCPSS Superintendent about this topic. Initial concerns were about students walking to school in the dark. Columbia Village level discussions were about walking school buses.

Ms. Natalie Hall, HCHD, said the Howard County
Department of Transportation was addressing student
safety in walking to school in conjunction with HCPSS. She
said to reach out to HCPSS and / or Howard County
Department of Transportation for any questions.

Howard County Police Department Initiatives

Ms. Lloyd introduced Sgt. Shapree Romanoff, Youth Services Division of the Howard County Police Department (HCPD). Sgt. Romanoff talked about the following HCPD initiatives: Youth Engagement Programs, the hiring of more Crossing Guards and Public safety and traffic enforcement initiatives in Howard County.

Ms. Romanoff is part of the Youth Engagement section of the HCPD, spoke about crossing guards staffing and employment by the HCPD. The HCPD is hoping to fill 25 crossing guards' positions, part-time work. The first three weeks of school – HASTE assignments. Help with seat belt safety, traffic patterns safety, speed enforcement, child safety laws, pedestrians.

Ms. Romanoff said the HCPD has a variety of youth programs being offered to the HC community. HCPD have various camps that are mentorship and leadership programs in the Summer and includes different age groups. One of the camps is the Police Academy camp which teaches about different careers within the Police Department as well as internet safety.

Ms. Romanoff spoke about the CAP Program, which is a Pop-Up camp throughout the Summer in various locations within Howard County for four weeks. This camp includes a variety of activities such as fishing, sports activities, video games, and board games. This camp is for
