members spreading throughout their respective networks: The Cancer program is currently trying to engage youth (ages 13 – 21) in its Youth Ambassador Program through the Cancer and Tobacco Coalition. Youth input is being sought due to the increase in the number of youths that are vaping in Howard County. The Coalition meets 4 times a year from 4 -6 pm at the Howard County Health Department. Community services hours are available for attendees. The Breast and Cervical Cancer screening program is also looking to get more women referred in order to be screened. The colorectal cancer program is looking to recruit more Howard County residents to get colorectal cancer screenings. The tobacco cessation program is additionally looking for more participants and is planning to switch its focus on behavioral health clients to improve participation numbers. Brian England of British American Auto Care shared with the group that the company's blog has been partnering with the Local Health Improvement Coalition to develop and publish entries on its blog. The most recent blog entry focused on National Physical Fitness and Sports Month and can be found here. Previous health-related entries focused on falls prevention and mental health first aid.
