Pat Gussio, of Health Care Access Maryland informed the group that the Open Enrollment period (Nov. 1 – Dec. 15) is underway. She also stated that, due to new changes by the federal government, there's been a price increase in the Silver plans offered on the Marketplace. However, this may increase the assistance an applicant receives. Additionally, many Gold level plans may be cheaper than their Silver counterparts, so this is another method of cost saving. Pat Gussio also suggested that, if Marketplace prices were too expensive, an individual could go directly to a broker or the insurance company itself. Miriam Bennett of the Department of Community Resources and Services shared the following:

- The previous dental screening and services fairs were largely successful.
 Over 450 people were engaged in total.
 There were over 100 cleanings performed and over 320 treatments provided. Due to the success of the event, Quinton Askew of DCRS is planning to partner with HOPE for Tomorrow to hold another larger dental event March 17th, 2018. The event will have a capacity of 350 people that can receive cleaning and treatment services.
