Ms. Richey shared the Health Literacy for Community Health Workers (CHWs) training model. This model was developed with CHWs for CHWs and builds health literacy knowledge and skills to help community members find, understand, and use health information and services.

Ms. Richey showcased the Web Content Review Tool and how it can help organizations review their web content so that users can find, understand, and use available information.

Further, Ms. Richey shared that the Horowitz Center will begin hosting webinars providing tips and tricks for plain languages utilization, data visualization, and health literacy for CHWs training modules.

Dr. Rossman inquired if the same plain language methods can be applied to verbal communication specifically multimedia like health information videos. Ms. Richey indicated that plain language methods can be applied to all forms of communication. The tips shared for verbal communication were:

- Being aware of how quickly you are speaking
- How much information your conveying
- Creating message that addresses audience priorities

It was inquired how the public would hear about the information resources housed in the Consumer Health Information Hub. Ms. Richey mentioned that the Hub was recently created, and the first goal was ensuring agencies and organizations were utilizing the hub then it would be promoted to public.

Ms. Erin Ashinghurst, Accessible Resources for Independence, noted that Plain language materials available for new mothers expecting children with and without disability would be important for Howard County residents.

HCLHIC Workgroup Updates Ms. Rambharat introduced the co-chairs to provide updates on their perspective workgroups.

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Jennifer Lee, Office on Aging and Independence, provided updates for the Chronic Disease Prevention and Management Group (CDPMG). CDPMG Updates included:

- CDPMG members held 75 chronic disease related events and activities reaching thousands of HC community members.
- CDPMG members hosted 35 chronic disease related evidence-based programs or classes with around 265 completers.
- The Community engagement team had staff trained in Diabetes Self-Management Education
- The LHIC Chronic Disease Health Action Item has been updated to feature Cervical Cancer Awareness resources and information.
- Office on Aging and Independence has launched a Living Well website to provide another access point for community members to register for Living Well in the Community education-based classes.
- Ongoing Chronic Disease Self-management programs (CDSMP) flier that has been updated for the 2024 schedule.

Ms. Carrie Ross, Community Action Council of Howard County (CAC-HC), provided updates for the Food Security Committee updates included:

- The Food Connection Map, digital and print copies of food pantries and hot meals brochures and resource guide for providers updated.
- Nutrition education will continue at Talbott Springs Elementary school at the gardens established.
- Ace Hardware will be providing seeds for Owen Brown Place, and the Committee is requesting community members/partners assist with

growing seeds into seedlings to give to the residents.

- CAC-HC is exploring hosting a Pop-Up food pantry at Ducketts Lane ES in March (during Spring Break week) to support families when students do not have access to school meals.
- Food Security Roundtables Report finalized and available on LHIC website

Ms. Rambharat emphasized that she is working on the formation of a Food Council in Howard County and welcomes insight from LHIC members during the process.

Ms. Lynn Rubin Traversa, University of Maryland-Extension, highlighted the importance of a Food Council being set up in Howard County.

Ms. Nancy Ervin, University of Maryland-Extension, added that Snap-Ed has nutrition education lesson.

Ms. Karen Basinger, University of Maryland-Extension, suggested reaching out to North Laurel residents and the agriculture program to assist in growing seedlings for the seedling project.

Ms. Samantha Cribbs, Howard County Health Department, provided updates for the Growing Healthy Families Workgroup. Growing Healthy Families updates included:

- There were 20 partners who attended the first workgroup meeting.
- The LHIC's Maternal, Infant, Child Health webpage was updated with additional resource.
- Increased promotion of childbirth classes from JHHCMC.
- Recruitment is ongoing for MomCares doula training
- The first cohort of doulas have begun to take referrals for 2024
- Plans are in the works for the Black Maternal Health Week initiatives in April

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Ms. Terri Hansen, Office on Aging and Independence, mentioned that April is National Minority Health Month and was curious if LHIC promotes that during April. Ms. Rambharat affirmed that LHIC promotes national month health observances and partner events associated with them through LHIC social media and newsletters.

Ms. Jessica Fisher, Howard County Health Department, provided updates for the Healthy Minds and Suicide Prevention Coalition (HMSPC). HMSPC updates included:

- Suicide Prevention and Mental Health programs flier has been updated for plain language
- The LHIC Suicide Prevention- and Mental Health webpages updated
- Further there will be a HMSPC interest flier circulating in the community so LHIC members should be on the lookout for that
- Expanded development of goals and initiatives for 2024
 - Working on developing campaign to address lethal means and safe storage in Howard County
 - Lighting up green in May for Mental Health Awareness

Dr. Rossman, asked Jessica to expand on her efforts bringing evidence-based programs into Howard County public schools. Sources of Strength is an evidence-based peer leadership and suicide prevention program for high school students in Howard County.

Ms. Erin Ashinghurst, Accessible Resources of Independence, provided updates for the Health Literacy Advisory Committee (HLAC). Health Literacy Advisory Committee updates included:

 The HLAC action plan has been updated to reflect the groups commitment to improve the

- health and independence of people with disabilities.
- First iteration of Disability Inclusion Grant project completed through funding from MDH to address disparities among individuals living with disabilities in Howard County.
 - Previous success has led to being awarded funding for second round of project in 2024.
- The Healthy Howard Campaign print materials are available on the Healthy Howard County webpage and materials are being translated in to six different languages.

Ms. Michelle Rosenfeld, Office on Aging and Independence, provided updates for the Movement Group. Movement Group updates included:

- Movement group partners and members arranged 47 events during Walktober.
- The workgroup created a Movement logo to promote physical activity in Howard County.
- The Movement flier was updated to include free and low-cost physical activities in Howard County.
- Created a favorite's folder in CAREAPP that lists
 33 reduced cost and free exercise programs in Howard County.
- The group will be emphasizing falls prevention efforts along with ongoing movement efforts
