- **Council Bill 17 – 2015**, Healthy Food and Beverages – County Properties

Council Bill 17 -2015

Summary

- Requires healthy food and beverage options to be provided at all youth-oriented county government facilities and programs.
- Establishes the Howard County Healthy Food and Beverage Standards, with 4 exemptions to the requirements.
- On all other county properties 75% of food/beverage options must meet the established standards.
- Healthy options must be:
 - Displayed on top shelves of vending machines; and
 - Priced at least \$0.25 less than allowed higher calorie food/beverages.

Summary continued...

- The Health Department would be responsible for: monitoring implementation; evaluating impact; reviewing the established standards and making recommendations in a bi-annual report.
- The Office of Purchasing would be required to: enforce the tenets of the bill; monitor compliance; and respond to complaints.

Council Bill 17 – 2015

Amendments

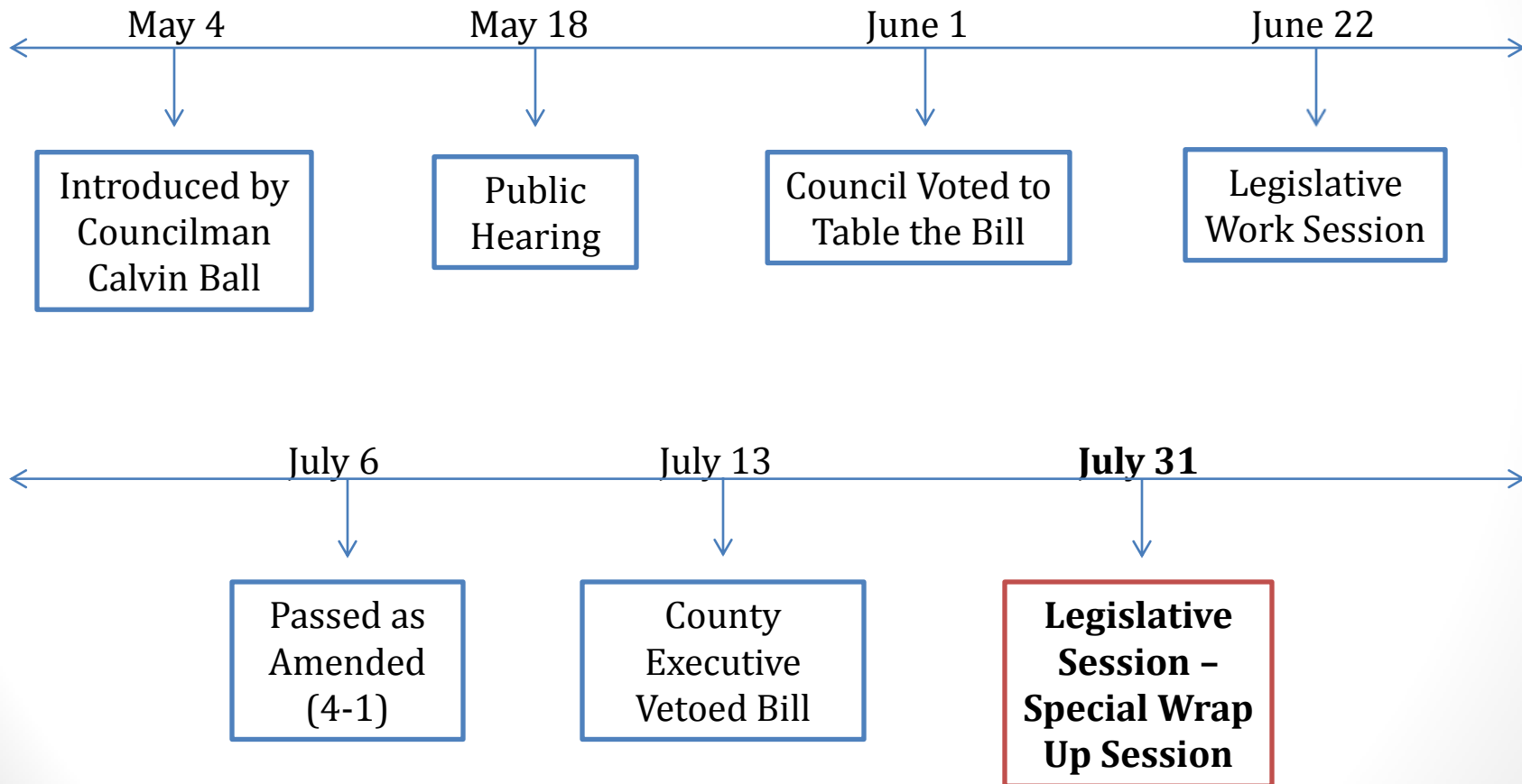
1. **Amendment 1** would:

- a) Delete the definition of “Food or beverage concession” and “Youth Oriented Government Facility”;
- b) Create a definition for “Packaged”;
- c) Alter the definition of “Healthy food or beverage” and “Youth-Oriented County Government Program”;
- d) Change the requirements for Food and Beverages on County Property;
- e) Change the requirements in the standards;
- f) Alter the Exemptions section;
- g) Delete the Pricing provision;
- h) Alter the Placement section (healthy options visible at every level);
- i) Change the Contracts section; and
- j) Change the Monitoring/Recommendations section and the Enforcement and Compliance section (Dept. County Admin).

2. **Amendment 2** clarifies that the water required to be available at county-sponsored events must be “potable water”.

Council Bill 28 -2015

Summary

- Prohibits the use of electronic smoking devices (ESDs) in certain public places, at a public meeting, in a government vehicle, and in a place of employment.
- To achieve prohibition, this bill:
 - 1) Defines ESDs and vaping;
 - 2) Adds ESDs, vapor, and/or nicotine to the definitions of retail tobacco store, tobacco product, and smoking;
 - 3) Excludes patches from the definition of smoking and tobacco product; and
 - 4) Requires a sign to be posted at public entrances in buildings or areas regulated by this subtitle.

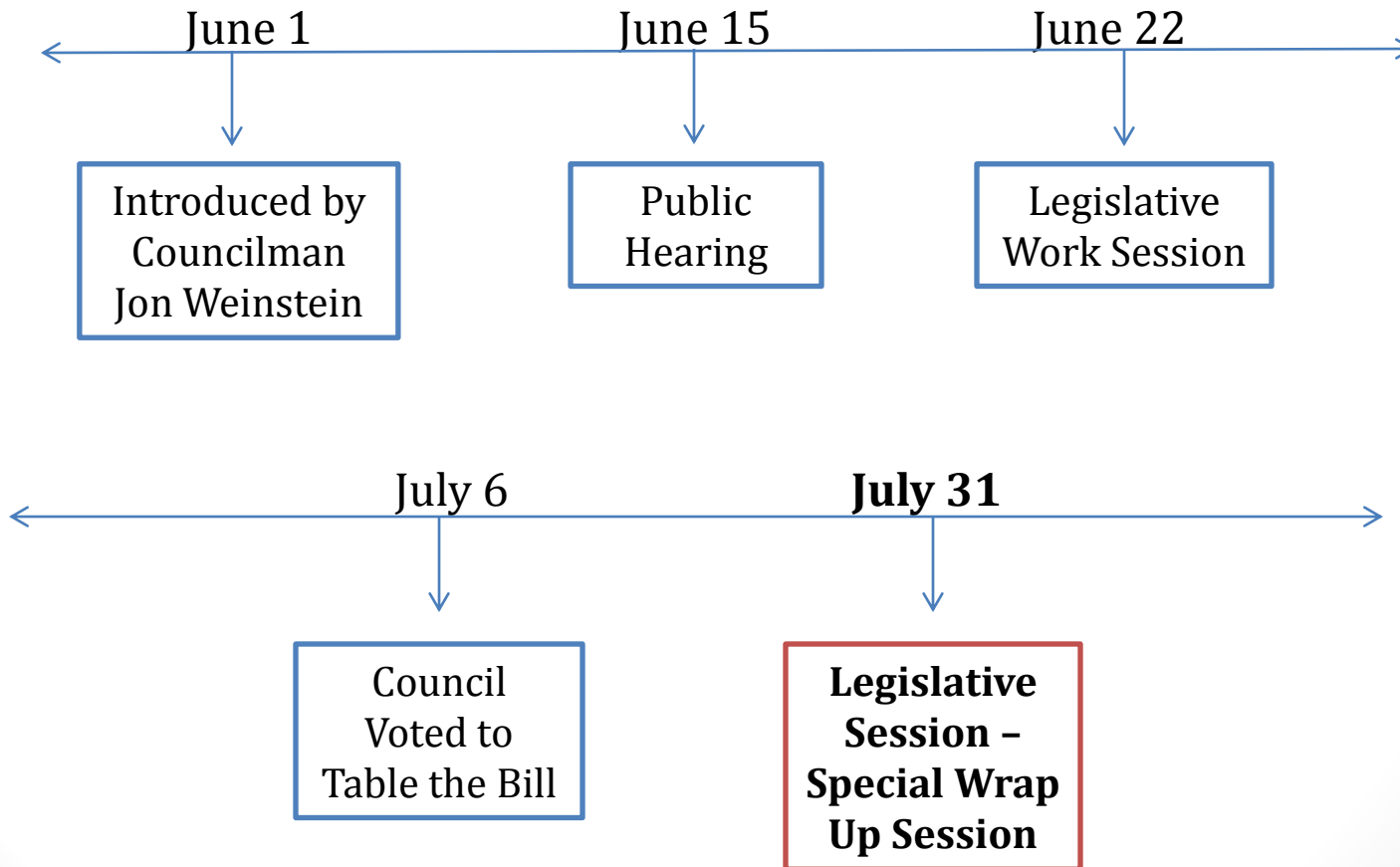
