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Birth Outcomes and Healthy Aging	Center. This event will provide a presentation and an opportunity for individuals to sign up for future Aging Friendly work groups. Ms. Hansen stated that AARP Network of Age- Friendly States and Communities was established in 2012, and as of November 19 th there were 406 communities nationwide and 830 communities worldwide. Ms. Hansen also pointed out that in 2045, people age 60+ will account for about 28% of the total population in Howard County and discussed AARP's 8 Domains of Livability. Erin Anderson, Community Health Nurse for Howard County Health Department, presented data regarding Birth Outcomes and Mental Health in Howard County. Ms. Anderson reviewed the 2017 annual report of Howard County data trends including: 1) 2018 Preliminary data, 2) 2017 Birth Statistics, 3) 2010-2017 fetal/infant death, 4) 2013-2017 premature birth, and 5) Perinatal Periods of Risk.
