Opening Remarks	Health Improvement Coalition called the meetings to order at 1:00 PM.	
Announcements	The Maryland Health Benefit Exchange extended the special enrollment period until June 15 th . During the Healthy Aging work group call on Friday April 3 ^c 2020 Kelly Kesler shared that the Howard County Government had launched a new online tool that morning (https://bit.ly/2xIV6SA), which allows users to track the number of active and recovered COVID-19 cases in Howard County, as well as deaths related to the virus. The tool is expected to be updated daily but it should be noted that due to the timing of updates, data may differ from other COVID-19 related dashboards.	Uninsured Marylanders may enroll through the state's health insurance marketplace www.marylandHealthConnection.gov , download the free "Enroll MHC" mobile app or by calling 1-855-642- 8572 from 8 a.m. to 6 p.m. on weekdays - Request or select "Coronavirus Emergency Special Enrollment Period."
COVID-19 Updates	During the April 1 st and April 3 rd work group meetings, Kelly Kesler offered remarks on behalf of Dr. Rossman who was unable to join the calls due to the emergency response. During the April 2, 2020 Healthy Weight work group call, Dr. Rossman offered key information and provided HCHD organizational updates for addressing COVID-19 in Howard County. She commended all the Howard County government partners and agencies that are working together to promote resources and services available for the citizens of Howard County during this pandemic. Social distancing and physical activity were discussed and Dr. Rossman affirmed that it is important to find ways to be physically active while the Governor's stay at home order is in effect (I.e. going outside for a walk). COVID-19 testing was discussed and the opening of a testing site at the Maryland VEIP testing sites in Howard County located on Broken Land Parkway in Columbia was discussed. At the time of this call the site was awaiting final approval. Kelly Kesler discussed preliminary results from the HCLHIC Member Communications Survey: COVID-19 Resources and Response. According to the survey, members indicated that updates on 1) Medical Updates on COVID-19, 2) Communications Updates on COVID-19, and 3) COVID-19 and Special Populations and 4) Social isolation during the COVID-19 pandemic would be important topics to be support the communities served by the organizations they represent. Members Updates
and Discussion of
COVID-19 Response

[Access to Care Workgroup 04.01.2020]

Heidi Weiss-Beedie from Howard County Health Department shared that the Health Department's Foreign-born Population program has been busy helping to provide its clients services via tele-medicine and that clients have indicated increased stress due to job loss.

Vanda Lerdboon from Howard County Health
Department shared the We Care Initiative launched in
January. The initiative focuses on two residential
buildings with high 911 utilization and is working with
the Chronic Disease program to do a needs assessment
in those complexes.

Jennifer Lee from the Howard County Department of Community Resources and Services, Office on Aging and Independence shared that they are strategizing ways to offer evidence-based programs such as Chronic Disease Self-Management in virtual formats. Additionally, she shared that the Department's Health Promotion program is working to develop videos that promote staying active at home and that address mental health, stress and anxiety.

Shanika Cooper from Howard County Health
Department discussed the increased need for Medicaid
services due to changes in employment status resulting
from COVID-19 related lay-offs and closures.
Additionally, it was noted the Medical Assistance
Transportation Program is operating with
modifications. Ms. Cooper shared that no new
coverages have been extended during the special open
enrollment period for undocumented workers who

Shawni Paraska from Columbia Association discussed current changes to operations and closures and shared that Open Space and Golf Course workers continue to maintain these spaces. Pathways remain open, but the tot lots are closed. Although the clubs are closed, a limited number of team members are providing safety and operational checks, maintenance, and cleaning. Preparations for summer activities are still underway.

Melanie Berdyck from Giant Food shared that nutrition education services are now being offered online.

Additionally, Giant Food is offering Nutrition at Noon webinars Monday – Friday and is offering its Six Weeks to Wellness classes virtually.

Mary Ann Barry from Transition Howard County shared that the activities through public gardens are on hold due to COVID-19. However, they are working with organizations to provide education and guidance for people that may want to start a garden at home.
